


#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**


Learning throughout the school this term has a Geography theme. This was evident in the texts

#### YEAR GROUP HIGHLIGHTS THIS WEEK

**Reception**: have been planning expeditions and exploring the bear caves that have arrived in their classroom. There has been much excitement about bear spotting and talk of different types of bears.

**Year 1:** children have been learning which countries make up the UK and where we live in the UK. They have also been thinking about their class and individual goals.

**Year 2**: have been developing their knowledge of the Earth's layers by making plasticine models building up from the core, through the mantle to the crust.

# The Hideaway Forest School Club

Did you know that The Hideaway forest school club deliver forest school to each child in their reception year at school and we also have two childcare offerings for you.
