



Dear Parent and Carer,

Welcome back to a new term - our mid-point for the year. It is hard to believe that half of this academic year has already passed, but this week, as we have been discussing childrens' progress, we can see how much learning has taken place since September. It was great to see so many family members this morning visiting their children's classrooms to share and celebrate this.

We have introduced this term's Core Learning skills through the ELLI character Curious Cat. In assembly I shared 'On a Beam of light' a text about Einstein as he grew up; celebrating the importance of curiosity and questions. Today we thought about the power of questions when talking about the climate change protest; thinking about how we need to wonder about the effect what we do has on our environment. Year 2 also got to really flex their curiosity yesterday on their outing to We the Curious.

The Jigsaw PSHE focus this term is Healthy Me. In this we learn about rest, exercise and food in maintaining a healthy lifestyle. We are encouraging children to recognise the need for rest as well as exercise by giving them the choice of the active and calm playgrounds. Year 1 have also had some additional sports this week with Shine.

Governors and school staff would like to thank parents for their contributions to the parent survey. There was a high uptake and responses will be considered in future actions. Some of the themes were: understanding curriculum expectations, knowing about your child's progress and consistency of approach to behaviour. We will answer these queries more fully in the near future, but in the meantime I would like to direct you to the School Life area of our website where you can find EYFS and National Curriculum expectations as well as the

CORONA VIRUS UPDATE

Dear Parents

The latest advice for returning travellers is as follows:

If you have returned from the following Category 1 areas, call NHS 111 to inform them of your recent travel, go home and then self-isolate even if you do not have symptoms:

- Iran
- Specific lockdown areas in Northern Italy as designated by the Government of Italy
Bertonico; Casalpusterlengo; Castelgerundo; Castiglione D'Adda; Codogno; Fombio; Maleo; San Fiorano; Somaglia; Terranova dei Passerini; Vo
- Daegu or Cheongdo, Republic of Korea)
- Hubei province, China (returned in the past 14 days)

If you have returned from the following Category 2 areas you don't need to take any special precautions. If you develop symptoms, however mild, you should stay indoors at home, self-isolate and call NHS 111.

What the campus schools will do

We will continue to follow specific guidance for schools issued by Public Health England and the Department for Education, which is updated regularly. We expect staff and pupils to observe the guidance issued concerning self-isolation, when appropriate.

If a member of staff or a pupil becomes unwell after visiting a Category 1 area, we will isolate them and call NHS 111 for further advice (or an ambulance if this is deemed necessary). Once they leave, the area will be cleaned in line with current guidance. NHS 111 will also provide advice to the patient.

If a member of staff or a pupil is suspected of having contracted the virus, current advice is that there is no need to close the school.

If a case of COVID-19 is confirmed for a member of staff or a pupil, the local Public Health England Health Protection Team will support the school to identify people who have been in contact with them and will provide advice on any actions or precautions that need to be taken. This advice is likely to include a requirement for contacts to self-isolate for 14 days. The Health Protection Team will carry out an assessment of each school with relevant staff. Advice on the management of pupils and staff will be based on this assessment and shared with our campus community.

Outside those that are defined as close contacts, the rest of the school does not need to take any precautions or make any changes to their own activities attending educational establishments or work as usual, unless they become unwell. If they become unwell they will be assessed as a suspected case depending on their symptoms. This advice applies to teaching staff and children in the rest of the class who are not in a close friendship group. The decision as to whether pupils, students and staff fall into this contact group or the closer contact group will be made between the Health Protection Team, the educational setting and (if they are old enough) the student.

We can all help to prevent the spread of respiratory viruses:

- **If you need to cough or sneeze – catch it, bin it, kill it**
- **Wash hands with soap and water:**
 - Before leaving home**
 - Before cooking or eating**
 - Arriving at school**
 - After using the toilet**
 - After break and PE or sports activities**

We will issue further guidance as required.
