Dear Parent/Carer

We continue to be incredibly proud of the learning that children are engaged in at home. The effort the children are making and pride they have in their achievements is cause for celebration. We thank you for your commitment to supporting this.

In school this week, senior leaders worked along side our Local Authority Education Partner to monitor writing across the school. As part of this we looked at the offer for the different ability ranges with in school and how this translated to home learning. We were able to evidence high quality provision that has less to good progress across the school. Again, parent input at home both during the terms when school has been open to all children, and during lockdown has been important in ensuring children's progress and we are very grateful for this.

Some families have been in contact about school plans for term 4. Following the announcement that schools will remain closed to all except children of critical workers and vulnerable children until at least 8th March, the senior leadership team and governors are making decisions that will be communicated with parents before the end of next week. We appreciate your need to plan ahead and ask for your patience, allowing us to respond to this latest update.

Guidance for parents in managing home learning was published by the Education Endowment Fund this week.
