Dear Parent/Carer,

We are proud to see how well children are continuing to settle back into routines in school. The excitement levels are still quite high, and we are working to channel this into some high engagement in learning. Around the school this week I have been impressed with the engineering skills, teamwork and discussion amongst Reception children who have been using the large construction outside; and by Year 1 who used maths problem solving skills, requiring them to learn like Linking Spider to solve missing number problems. Year 2 have used incredibly persuasive writing skills in their speeches as the astronaut Mary Jackson and were Curious Cats in the micro-habitat hunt around school grounds.



Children are finding lunchtime routines and behaviours more of a challenge to adjust to. In school this week we have spent time reinforcing expectations for good table manners as well as showing respect to the adults who prepare and serve meals or support lunch sittings and playtimes. We would be very grateful if this message to show good manners and be respectful could be followed up at home. Having a calm lunchtime is incredibly important in ensuring children feel settled and are ready for afternoon learning.

Using the observations and assessment made during these first weeks back, teaching staff are starting to plan ahead to next term. Using our 'recovery curriculum' strategy, we are

identifying the pivotal learning required to ensure maximum progress as well as protecting time for important aspects of social and emotional development. We know that many important aspects of the school calendar have been missed this year, so will work to include as many enrichment events as possible in the summer terms. Mrs Gibson has re-booked a day of drama workshops with Travelling Light that FHIS have agreed to fund and Year 2 are already planning leaver's events. We end the term with a short week when we will engage in another exciting whole-school themed week, then start with fresh topics after Easter. Look out for 'wow' day information in blogs.

As well as new themes for learning, there will be some new business operations structures in school after Easter tying in with the new financial year.

Following 11 and 27 years respectively, Beverly Stevens and Amanda Binley our Bursar and Finance Assistant will be leaving our school at the end of Term 4, as will Hannah Walker who has been a great support in her role as Finance Administrator over the past year. We are incredibly grateful for their dedication and commitment to improving outcomes for our children and wish them all every success and happiness in their next venture. Mrs Bishop who has been shielding this term, begins her maternity leave after Easter. We are excitedly waiting the new arrival to the Bishop family and thank Mrs Bishop for her important contributing to the Class 7 and Year 2 team this year. Class 7 will be taught by Mrs Mortimer

from Wednesday afternoon to Friday during terms 5 and 6. The children will be introduced to their new teacher in the last week of term and teachers will work together to ensure a smooth transition.

We also say an official farewell to Mrs Hale who is moving away from Bristol with her family at the end of her maternity leave, so will not be rejoining us after Easter.

Lastly, we say farewell to Hunter in Class 6 who is moving back to New Zealand next week. We have loved having you as part of our school and look forward to keeping in contact through emails and perhaps a Google Meet.
