Headteacher update:

Happy New Year!

It has been great to hear from children that so many families had a good break and to see the vast majority of children return to school this week. The past three days have been really calm and productive in school-a great start to the new year and term.

This week I have had the pleasure of meeting with teachers to discuss pupil progress from the Autumn terms. There is a lot to celebrate with class and individual successes across the curriculum. These successes have been possible due to the focus on children's social-emotional skills, ensuring they are settled, ready to learn and have the listening skills and resilience to access the curriculum. Particular highlights include achievements in maths which is currently the strongest core subject area across the school and Year 2 Phonics Screening outcomes which exceed the previous 2 years results, evidencing the impact of the new phonics progression and supporting progress in both reading and spelling. We need parents to continue to support their child's reading progress by taking responsibility for finding time for 1-to-1 reading at home at least 5 times a week. This practise is vital to build on the teaching that happens in school and has a huge impact. Please remember to update reading records and tick off bookmarks to keep us informed about your child's efforts. We have heard of our first pupil to complete their bookmark and it would be fantastic to be able to celebrate


We had year group assemblies each day this week to set out our dreams and goals rather than a celebration assembly this week.
