settling out their class charters and all staff are committed to supporting your children to meeting our shared aims. We rely on parents to support us in these aims and to ensure they help their children to uphold our rules and expectations before and after school so that children receive a shared message. #### Communication:

We all recognise how busy family life is and equally know you want to support your child's best interests as well as you possibly can, so our aim is to streamline our communication channels. We will do this through the information we share on our website and through this weekly bulletin. We know too much information can be overwhelming so, ask that you commit to checking the class blog for the start of each week so that you can prepare your child for events coming up as well as the learning taking place. It is also very important that you read this weekly communication which signposts essential dates and school business and will contain important messages.

In your communication with us, please bear in mind that in a school consisting of over 250 adults and children, responding to emails cannot always take priority. We want to be able to prioritise time to respond to communication regarding children's welfare, so ask that you think about the most appropriate way to find/share non-essential messages. Teachers in particular are in front of classes throughout the day and have planned meetings before and after school, so need to use their remaining time to plan for the children rather than answer email requests for information that could be found elsewhere. Our website has pages detailing specifics about the curriculum, policies, booking wrap around care, reporting absence, safeguarding etc and we ask that you use this before contacting teachers or the school office.

Staff are in the playground or at classroom doors at the start and end of each day and are always happy to hear messages. Any message relating to that day (e.g. a playdate or change in pick up

arrangements) should be shared verbally as a teacher is unlikely to read emails until the school day ends. The school office is understanding of working parents who cannot pass messages on face-to-face, so will verbally pass on essential messages received via email.

Myself or other members of the Senior Leadership Team are here to welcome you in the playground each morning so do introduce yourselves and let us know if we can help.

We look forward to working in partnership with you again this year in some exciting learning and events.
