2.7 Inclusive Sport in Bristol


This email is from members of the Bristol City youth council; a group of young people elected in February 2022 to represent the young people of Bristol. This year, a group of us are focusing on disability sport access, as a part of our health campaign. Attached to this email is a document containing a collection of disability sport organisations across Bristol. We are extremely passionate about getting the word out about these groups, as currently young people with disabilities find it extremely difficult to discover their existence, and this shouldn't be the case. In our group we are lucky to have Samuel Richards who has personal experience with this topic. Here is a note from him:

My name is Samuel Richards and I have Cerebral palsy and Hearing loss, and the document that is attached is a very personal thing for me. My family and I find it really hard to find disability sport and I never had a chance to look at a document like this, which had all of the disability sports you can access around Bristol. It's a big passion of mine for all children with disabilities to have access to this document, as I feel like I missed out on these opportunities earlier. This is why we've sent it to you today.
