### **Curriculum Update: Computing**

As children may be receiving new tech for Christmas this is a good time to check that the settings for these and other devices are protecting children from online harm.

At school we sometimes hear of children accessing content that is not age-appropriate and this can cause fear in some case and in others, may be seen through inappropriate topics in their play and [talk](#).

Examples this year have been related to 'Huggy Wuggy' which on face value looks to be a soft toy, but in fact is from a game which has violent storylines.



As well as checking the safety settings on devices at home, you can check the age appropriate ratings for most TV, film and online resources via [Common Sense Media](#).
