# Headteacher update:

Our school has continued to build on the fantastic start made last week with all classes rising to the challenge of new year group expectations. Reception classes have been AMAZING, learning our rules and routines, developing independence in self-selecting activities and resources and making new friends (as well as carrying lunch trays-quite a tricky skill!). Year 1 are showing their new maturity in completing Rainbow Challenges; balancing their own individual choices alongside adult-directed activities and have been great in looking after new friends to the school. Year 2 had a wonderful 'Wow day' this week working hard on the planning so that the banquet, medieval dancing and shield making was a success.

Thank you to all parents/carers who came to the KS1 'back to school' meetings on Tuesday. We hope you found them informative. We had feedback from some parents that they are keen to find out more about how to support reading at home. We have taken this on board and are considering the best way to reach as many of you as possible with practical tips. In the meantime you can visit the <u>Reading and Phonics</u> section of our curriculum pages (scroll down to videos). We are hosting phonics learn-a-longs later this term (17/18th Oct) where you can join the class phonics session to see how this aspect of reading is taught in school and get a sneak peak at what your child's experience in this area of learning is like. Your role in prioritising reading practise at home (aiming for at least 5 short sessions per week) is vital to your child's success. Teachers, and our Reading lead, Mrs Hibbard are always happy to answer questions you may have.

Reception children will each be working with an adult to complete the statutory Reception Baseline over the next week. Neither school or parents get any information from this at this stage (the data will be used to measure progress at the end of Year 6) but we also use our own observations to get to know what your child's individual strengths and next steps are. To communicate with all parents/carers on how their child is getting on across the curriculum, planned parents evenings will be taking place at the beginning of Term 2 (dates are on the school calendar). Please note we do not have an open morning at this early stage of the year, but have set dates for February and July.
