Curriculum Updates:

Religion and Worldviews:

Harvest at Henleaze Infant School - Monday 16th October

Our Religion and Worldviews Curriculum goes far beyond only special festivals for different faiths, but we do teach children about some of the many different faith and culture celebrations. At this time of year, at around Harvest (the traditional Christian festival of thanksgiving for God's provision) we ask children to reflect on how we might help those in need, and invite families to make donations of dried or canned foods which are given to organisations in our city who support some of the most vulnerable people in Bristol. This year, we will be sharing donations between the Salvation Army, with whom the school has a long-standing connection, and B+A Church who regularly support Bristol families in need. Part of our Statutory Agreed Local Syllabus for RE is to teach children why Christians consider it important to care for those in need. We will have visitors from the Salvation Army in school on Monday 16th October to tell the children a little about their work. We will also discuss with children how people of other faiths, and other worldviews might also want to care for those in need.







If your family is celebrating a special festival, please do let your class teacher know, as we do encourage children to share their experiences and always to value and respect differences.

Website update - new online safety section!

We have just launched an area on our website aimed at supporting both parents and children with online safety. There are lots of useful links for parents with information about a variety of aspects of online safety, including: parental control settings, screen time recommendations, app and game reviews (that include age ratings) and advice on how to start up conversations with your child/ren about online safety. Online Safety Mascot Competition

To enter:

- -The competition is open to KS1 only (with the idea that we will run the competition every 2 years, so current Reception will have a chance to enter when they are in Year 2)
- -Entries should be emailed or handed to your child's teacher by the deadline of Monday 6th November.
