#### Headteacher update:

We were so please to see that so many parents made it to the writing meeting this morning. This year we have changed the way we share some of our curriculum information with you, moving away from the traditional 'whole curriculum' evening session in Autumn which we think was probably quite overwhelming, to deliver some more bite-sized chunks throughout the year; through the phonics learn along, the online safety information evening and videos as well as this morning's session today with Mrs Gibson to focus on writing. From the attendance today, we feel that we are hitting the right note and hope that you are getting what you need. The huge turnout was a happy surprise, so apologise that the space was rather tight! As a school, we are always reflective and aim to respond to your valued feedback. The annual parent/carer survey is a really useful way to capture your views and below is a summary of how staff and governors have responded to the survey from last summer.

#### Summary:

The survey received 102 responses, for context, the school counted 224 pupils at the time of the survey.

According to the survey, HIS children still feel happy (only 3% disagreed), safe (only 2% disagreed) and well cared for (none disagreed). 97% would recommend our school to another parent.

**Staff's excellent work** is clearly appreciated with teachers being celebrated numerous times and a few by name. More detail is shared around issues with **communication** (particularly around events) and some suggestions were made.

Our school is lucky to have been chosen as one of the causes for Tesco to support via their community grants initiative. This room will be used by whole classes, groups and individuals and offer an alternative learning space to help support children's mental health and well being. #### Use of the school bathrooms:

This term we are focusing on what it means to show respect. An area that we need families to support at home is in use of the shared bathrooms/toilets. A number of children are either unable to independently use toilet paper, or misusing it and we are finding toilets regularly blocked by excessive use or used toilet paper on the floor. It is also notable that the majority of children do not flush the toilet after use making it unpleasant for the next person. We are going to do some teaching on this topic at school, but this are of self-care and respect is something that would be more effectively taught at home and we would be grateful for your support.
