

Important Messages:

Attendance:

We are receiving a number of planned absence requests for term-time holidays that do not fall under 'exceptional circumstances'. Whilst we appreciate the value of important family time and understand there are cost implications associated with holidays out of term-time we strongly discourage you from taking your child out of school whenever avoidable. National and in-school data shows a strong link between 'persistent absence' and lower than average attainment. Persistent absence is anything below 90% which means just 3 missed days in a term (or 4 days in long terms) takes your child into the 'persistent absence category'. Due to the impact of missed learning, our school will issue Fixed Penalty Notices for unauthorised

absences beyond the 10 session (5 day) threshold. Please see the attached leaflet for information.
