Headteacher update:

It has been lovely to welcome you all back to the first of our two summer terms. The summer has so many additional enrichment events and diary dates to look forward to, it is always my favourite (and busy) time of year. On Tuesday, we received the names of the children who will be joining us in Reception. This is one of the highlights of the summer for me as we get to welcome new children and families to our community. If you have a child joining us and haven't already, please let the LA know you want to accept the space as this allows us to move forward with our induction programme.

The children currently in school have been introduced to new topics and texts that they will be using to 'hook' into their new learning over the coming terms. There will be a lot of work around the science topics of plants and animals; learning about growth and change (including their own bodies) as well as habitats, survival and understanding how to care for animals and their habitats. These units link nicely to the learning that takes place later in the summer, where we focus on the upcoming changes in year group (or school) and how to manage feelings around this. We know that for some children, this causes a bit of anxiety, so suggest parents keep this very low key for the next couple of months and then dove-tail timings with school after the half term break to focus on the positives of change, as well as how to manage worries. Knowing that as parents you may also be starting to think about next year in school, we want to reassure you that there are no major changes planned and that transition will be carefully planned and implemented as usual.

Thank you to parents for completing the short questionnaire regarding the additional INSET day on the 22nd and 23rd July. We can confirm these days are in addition to the INSET days already planned for this year and won't replace those planned at the start of September 2024. Schools Out Henleaze (SoH) will have capacity for the children who need to be cared for on the July INSET days. School (and SoH) will send out notification when they open for bookings for these days. Please note: the Google form was to gauge numbers rather than book a place, so you will need to book through SoH in order for your child to attend holiday club on the INSET days. The survey showed a very small minority (<10%) of families would want home learning to access, therefore we will not be planning activities for those 2 days. Instead, we will be signposting resources and activities that can be accessed throughout the holidays as we would ordinarily.
