#### Headteacher update:

We really love to hear about children's interests and achievements outside of school so this week were proud to share a swimming badge award for Jack in Daisy Class during our Celebration assembly today and on Monday to be treated to an assembly by Kofi in Daffodil Class telling us all about his adventures in London as an 'agent of change'.

Kofi, as a member of our Eco Committee and keen advocate of protecting our environment, had realised that he could communicate his knowledge about recycling and looking after our seas to his sister better through Makaton, so learned how to sign important the words to do this. Below is a summary form Kofi's mum to describe some of the amazing work he is doing outside of school and where this work took him:

"Outside of school Kofi is part of an 'Agents Of Change' group which is a wonderful network of young change-makers, honing their skills and leadership abilities to make the world a better place!

He's been invited to the Cabinet Office to deliver a speech at the heart of government about the importance of communication for all with a particular focus on using Makaton to help protect our planet.

This came about after he created his own campaign – all his own idea – which was partly inspired by his sister but also very much by his work on Henleaze School's Eco Committee.

He used an ipad to find out that there are 1.5 million people in the UK 'like Poppy' – who have a learning disability. and, each person in the UK on average produces 0.74kg of waste per day = 1,110,000kgs. He realised there is a huge opportunity here.

Kofi went on to film himself doing Makaton signs around protecting the planet and took about sharing this with his sister's school as well as other special schools in Bristol to help even more disabled children get involved too."

We were really fortunate to be taught Makaton signs to communicate about protecting the environment by Kofi in assembly on Monday. He was incredibly brave to speak in front of all of so many Henleaze Infant children and staff, but after speaking to MPs we must be a breeze!

We couldn't be prouder of Kofi, a pupil who truly embodies our HIS values.
